UDC RESOLUTION NO. 2017- 25**

SUBJECT: NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING, AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 6, INCREASING DAILY PARKING FEE FOR STUDENTS, FACULTY, AND STAFF WITH UNIVERSITY ISSUED IDENTIFICATION

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees (the “Board”) of the University of the District of Columbia (the “University”) pursuant to the authority set forth under the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Reorganization Act Amendments (Act) effective January 2, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-36; D.C. Official Code §§ 38-1202.01(a); 38-1202.06 (2001 & 2011 Supp.) sets the daily parking rate for the University’s parking garage.

WHEREAS, the University has been charging the existing daily parking garage rate for current students, faculty, and staff with active University issued identification for the previous six (6) years without an increase to the rate;

WHEREAS, the University seeks to avoid sporadic, significant daily parking garage rate increases while reflecting the current market rate of maintaining a parking garage by implementing an incremental daily parking garage rate increase for current students, faculty, and staff with University issued identification ;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia hereby takes proposed rulemaking action to amend Chapter 8 of the University Rules (Title 8-B6 DCMR) to increase the daily parking garage rate for current students, faculty, and staff for students, faculty, and staff with active University issued identification as indicated in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the General Counsel is hereby directed to publish this Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the D.C. Register as soon as is practicable for a comment period of not less than thirty (30) days, in accordance with the provisions of D.C. Official Code §2-505 (a).

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia pursuant to the authority set forth under the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Reorganization Act Amendments (Act) effective January 2, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-36; D.C. Official Code §§ 38-1202.01(a); 38-1202.06)(3),(13) (2001 & 2011 Supp.) hereby gives notice of its intent to amend chapter 6 (Campus Life) of subtitle B (University of the District of Columbia) of title 8 (Higher Education) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR) in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

The purpose of the proposed rulemaking is to increase daily parking rates for current students, faculty, and staff with active University issued identification beginning in the fall semester of 2017.

The Board of Trustees will take final action to adopt these amendments to the University Rules in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 6, CAMPUS LIFE, of subtitle B, UNIVERSITY OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, of title 8, HIGHER EDUCATION, is amended as follows:

Section 607, PARKING FEES, Subsection 607.4 is amended as follows:

607.4 The daily parking fee for students, Faculty, and Staff with active University issued identification shall be four dollars (\$4.00) per day, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

All persons desiring to comment on the subject matter of the proposed rulemaking should file comments in writing not later than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C.
