Montgomery College (hereafter referred to as MC), a community college in Montgomery County, Maryland and the University of the District of Columbia (hereafter referred to as UDC), a four-year institution in Washington, D.C., agree to offer an articulated program leading to the award of an Associate of Arts in Business and then a Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting with the option to have a concentration in Finance or Bachelor of Business Administration in Management with the option of having a concentration in Marketing or Management Information Systems. MC course agreements outlined below ensure that the transfer student will matriculate at junior standing.

## I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish collaboration between UDC and MC to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning one of the following: B.B.A. in Accounting and B.B.A. in Management. This Agreement provides a systematic plan for students to continue their higher education beyond the A.A. degree from MC. The following general principles guide the operation of this Agreement:

## II. ADMISSIONS

Applicants successfully completing the articulated program with a 2.0 or better grade point average who have not matriculated at any other institution of higher education will be guaranteed transfer admission to UDC. C is the minimum grade requirement for courses to transfer to UDC.

## III. ACCEPTANCE OF CREDITS

A maximum 90 credit hours from MC will be allowed toward fulfillment of the 120 credit hours required for baccalaureate completion. The courses noted in the Course Crosswalk (Appendix A) will transfer from MC to UDC as laid out in the course crosswalk. If courses are evaluated by MC and applied toward the A.A. in Business, the student must submit transcripts to be evaluated by UDC. Credit will be applied as determined by a UDC evaluation. A maximum of 30 credits will be accepted by UDC toward degree requirements from non-direct classroom instruction, including: (Advanced Placement (AP), the College Level Examination Program (CLEP), the DANTES Subject Standardized Tests (DANTES), SAT Subject Tests (SAT11), and International Baccalaureate (IB). Students who seek to earn credit through examination are required to submit official exam results and/or official transcripts directly to UDC from the testing agencies. Students can earn credit at UDC for elective credits. Students can earn credit by examination towards degree requirements only if separately approved by a student's Academic Department. Career and Technology Education credits will not transfer to UDC. Credit awarded for experiential learning ("life experience") is not recognized and is not transferable to UDC.

## IV. SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

MC students who have completed an A.A. in Business will be given every consideration for financial assistance and will be eligible to compete for need and non-need based academic scholarships at UDC as follows:

- (3) Odessa Starks Davis Scholarship
- (4) Pepco Scholarship
- (5) President's Round Table
- (6) School of Business and Public Administration Scholarship

#### V. BENEFITS TO STUDENTS

UDC offers the following benefits for MC students who transfer under this Agreement:

- (1) Transfer orientations conducted by UDC and by UDC's School of Business.
- (2) Transfer Advising

## VI. PROMOTION/OUTREACH

MC and UDC agree to publicize this Agreement via, but not limited to marketing materials and information sessions. UDC's logo and transfer pathway will be featured on MC's transfer agreements website. MC and UDC agree to collaborate to ensure successful transfer through Transfer Day visits and advising sessions.

## VII. TERM/MONITOR/REVIEW

- A. The initial term of this agreement shall be two years from the date of the last signature, with three (3) automatic renewals of two years each.
- **B.** MC and UDC further agree to monitor the performance of this Agreement and to review biennially.
- C. UDC will establish a mechanism to provide information on the academic progress of the MC student enrolled as a result of this Agreement, including but not limited to statistical data compiled from non-specific student information.
- **D.** MC and UDC agree to communicate program changes in a timely manner to avoid disruption of student progress toward degree completion.

#### VIII. TERMINATION

The Agreement may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice in writing to all parties. Termination of the Agreement will not affect any students currently enrolled at MC in the name or major at the time of termination, and they shall be able to transfer credits pursuant to this Agreement.
