

The Norma Holloway and Julius A. Johnson Endowed Scholarship

The University of the District of Columbia Foundation, Inc., and the Department of English announce the opening of competition for *The Norma Holloway and Julius A. Johnson Endowed Scholarship*. This scholarship was established by The Honorable Norma Holloway Johnson, United States District Judge for the District of Columbia, and The Honorable Julius A. Johnson, Administrative Law Judge, Retired, United States Department of Labor. Judge Norma Holloway Johnson is an alumna of the University. The scholarship provides opportunities for students enrolled as English majors at the University of the District of Columbia to complete their college education and acquire marketable job skills that will enhance their abilities to succeed as productive members of society.

Award

A \$1,000 scholarship award is made annually to cover tuition, fees, books, or other expenses directly related to completing the requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree in English at the University of the District of Columbia.

Eligibility

The scholarship is open to students who are entering the first semester of his or her senior year at the University of the District of Columbia, Department of English, who have maintained a minimum 3.0 grade point average. Applicants must write a 500 word essay on the topic, **“Why I Selected English as a Major.”** Essays must be typewritten and double-spaced. Applicants must also submit a UDC Scholarship Application and a letter of recommendation from a current or former English instructor. Applications and supporting documents **must be received** by the deadline date to be considered for this award. Materials will not be returned to the applicant.
