


Chart 1: Admissions Yield Rate*



Chart 2: Enrollment Trend



Figure 2: Percentage Distribution of Total Enrollment by Class Level: Fall 2022








Chart 2: Percent Distribution of Headcount Enrollment by Degree Level

Figure 4: Percentage Distribution of Headcount Enrollment by College Fall 2022





Annual Reach Report, 2021-2022 College of Agriculture, Urban Sustainability, and Environmental Sciences (CAUSES) Land-Grant Programs

With the passage of the Morrill Act in 1862, the United States government began providing federal support to establish a national system of land-grant colleges and universities that would focus on agriculture and mechanical arts, such as engineering. Since then, land-grant institutions have expanded their breadth to become leaders in teaching, research, and Cooperative Extension in multiple areas of interest relevant to the communities they serve. Land-grant institutions are located in every U.S. state and many territories.

UDC is the land-grant university in and for the nation's capital. The land-grant university functions are located within the College of Agriculture, Urban Sustainability, and Environmental Sciences (CAUSES).

UDC's land-grant programs are primarily offered through four Centers of Excellence & two Institutes. There are 4-H and Youth Development efforts in all centers.

- o Center for Urban Agriculture and Gardening Education
- Center for Urban Resilience, Innovation, and Infrastructure with the Water Resources Research Institute
- o Center for Nutrition, Diet, and Health with the Institute of Gerontology
- o Center for Urban Research, Engagement, and Scholarship

Funding Sources for CAUSES Land-Grant Programs

CAUSES receives funding from the National Institute for Food and Agriculture (NIFA) of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to support research and community outreach programs in pursuit of several objectives:

- Combat childhood obesity
- Improve food security and food safety
- Develop a diverse workforce
- Mitigate climate change impacts
- Develop sustainable energy solutions
- o Improve water safety and water management

CAUSES also receives funding from a range of additional public and private sources through grants and research expenditures.

Impact and Reach

Cooperative Extension ("Extension") connects the community. The capacity-funded Cooperative Extension System, based at land-grant institutions, provides a high volume of knowledge, training, and informal education to agricultural professionals and local communities. Extension advice and educational content are in high demand.

This year, UDC documented more than 39,000 direct contacts with adult and youth residents of the District of Columbia, Maryland, Virginia, and other related communities. These contacts occurred through workshops, demonstrations, program enrollments, volunteerism, and certificate courses. Programs are offered in all eight Wards of the District of Columbia. Individuals are given opportunities to participate online and in person and are welcome to participate in a course or workshop more than once.

The following data provides an overview of the impact of land-grant programs in the District of Columbia from September 2022 through August 2023.

Figure 6: UDC Employees Summary Total number of Employees: 1,009


