Brief History

- Our Fraternity was founded on January 5th, 1911 on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana. During this time, very few Blacks lived in Bloomington and those who did reside in Bloomington were subjects of harsh racial discrimination and prejudice. In the meantime, Indiana had become a stronghold for the Ku Klux Kan. The intolerance of blacks from this group fueled the negative mindset of other Whites residing there.
- Lynching's were a common practice, and this made the day-today lifestyle for Blacks rather arduous. Having the drive to achieve in school became nearly impossible.
- Our 10 illustrious founders Elder Watson Diggs, Byron K. Armstrong, John M. Lee, Ezra D. Alexander, Henry T. Asher, Guy L. Grant, Marcus P. Blakemore, Paul W. Caine, George W. Edmonds were God-fearing and like-minded men who established an prestigious grass-roots organization with the ultimate purpose being Achievement.

- HEALTH INITIATIVES Chapters facilitate, participate and coordinate activities that promote good health practices. Some of the programs are the Charles Drew Blood Drive and partnership with the American Diabetes Association.
- **VOTER REGISTRATION, EDUCATION AND MOBILIZATION** Chapters facilitate and participate in activities that uplift their communities through the power of the vote.
- <u>NAACP</u> Every district and chapter of the fraternity is required to maintain a Life Membership at Large in the NAACP. All members of the fraternity are encouraged to join the NAACP.
